WHO ARE WE?

The Victorian Sexual Assault Crisis Line (SACL) is a state-wide after-hours confidential telephone crisis service for victim/survivors of past and recent sexual assault and childhood sexual abuse.

SACL operates between 5pm and 9am weekdays and throughout weekends and public holidays.

OUR SERVICE

- Recognises and explores existing strengths and survival strategies.
- Emphasises that victim/survivors are the experts in their own lives.
- Supports victim/survivors to take control of their choices and decisions.
- Acknowledges that the crime of sexual assault is never the fault or responsibility of the victim/survivor.

WHO IS A VICTIM/SURVIVOR?

A victim/survivor is someone who has experienced, at any time in their life, any uninvited sexual behaviour which has made them feel fearful. humiliated or uncomfortable. Sexual assault can include a range of behaviours from unwanted touching, sexual harassment to rape with physical injury or threat to life.

WHAT DO WE DO?

The Sexual Assault Crisis Line provides:

- crisis counselling, support and advocacy to victim/survivors
- information about the impacts and myths of sexual assault and abuse
- information about legal rights
- referrals to appropriate services for ongoing support
- support to non-offending family/friends
- provides consultation and debriefing to other professionals.



If you have been sexually assaulted within the last two weeks, we can:

- coordinate an immediate face to face response with a counsellor/advocate from your nearest Centre Against Sexual Assault (CASA). This will take place in a private and safe place, called a crisis care unit
- provide information about your legal and medical options.
